The National Disability Data Asset is a new way to connect **data** about people with disability.

We call it the Data Asset for short.



#### **Data** is

- Facts
- Information
- · Records.



The data asset will help the **government** make **good decisions** to help people with disability.



The National Disability Data Asset

Council make sure the government
uses the data asset in a way that helps
people with disability.

We call them the **Council** for short.

### About the National Disability Data Asset Charter



The **National Disability Data Asset Charter** helps people understand how to use the data asset.

We call it **the Charter** for short.



The Charter was made by people in the disability community.



It tells everyone how to use the Data Asset.



The Council and the Charter will help people make good decisions about the Data Asset.

The Charter makes sure everyone uses the Data Asset in the right way.



The Charter has

- Principles
- Rules.



Principles say how the data asset **should work**.

**Everyone** has to do what the Charter says.



If anyone wants to change the Charter they need to

• Listen to ideas from the disability community



 Have the changes approved by the Council and the government.

Approved means they agree to the changes.

#### **Principles**



The Charter has principles for the Data Asset to be used in a good way.

The **principles** will help people understand how to use it.



The principles say the data asset will

Include people with disability.



Have information that is accessible.

Accessible means everyone can use it.

Like Easy Read.



• Help people with disability.



• Keep data safe.

#### Rules



The Charter has rules.

The rules tell everyone what

- Can
- Cannot

Happen with the data asset.



The data asset can be used for research.

#### Research means

- Finding out what people think about things.
- Using the information to help others.



The data asset can only be used for research that looks at

• How to understand people with disability.



• Programs to help people with disability.



 How Australia helps people with disability speak up about their rights.



Rights are rules about treating everyone

- Fair
- Equal.



• Making **inclusive** communities.

Inclusive is when everyone

- Can take part
- Feel like they **belong**.



 Help people with disability to find services.



- Help everyone understand about
  - People with disability
  - Their families
  - Supporters.

# What you cannot do with the data asset



The Charter has rules about what people **cannot** do with the Data Asset.



The data asset cannot be used to

• Share **personal information** about people.



Personal information is things like

- Your name
- Address
- Other information about who you are.



- Decide if a person can get government assistance like
  - Centrelink
  - NDIS



Be used in a way that

- Breaks the law
- Does **not** help people speak up about their rights.



Be used by a computer to make sure people follow the rules.

Like the rules to get government assistance.
